## Electronic Mail (e-mail)

It can take days to send a letter across the country and weeks to go around the world. To save time and money, more and more people are using electronic mail. It's fast, easy and much cheaper than the using the post office. Today, e-mail has become the most popular service on the internet.

E-mail is an electronic message sent from one computer to another. Using this facility you can send or receive personal and business-related messages with attachments, such as pictures or formatted documents. You can even send music and computer programs.

Just as a letter makes stops at different postal stations along its way, e-mail passes from one computer, known as a mail server, to another as it travels over the Internet. Once it arrives at the destination mail server, it is stored in an electronic mailbox until the recipient retrieved it. This whole process can take seconds, allowing you to quickly communicate with people around the world at any time of the day or night.

## Sending and Receiving e-mail Messages

To receive e-mail, you must have an account on a mail server. This is similar to having an address where you receive letters. One advantage over regular mail is that you can retrieve your e-mail from anywhere location. Once you connect to your mail server, you download your messages to your computer.

To send e-mail, you need a connection to the Internet and access to a mil sever that forwards your mail. The standard protocol used for sending Internet e-mail is called SMTP, short for Simple mail Transfer Protocol. It works in conjunction with POP severs. POP stands for Post Office Protocol. When you send an e-mail message, your computer routes it to an SMTP server. The server looks at the e-mail address (similar to the address on an envelope), then forwards it to the recipient's mail server, where it is stored until the addressee retrieves it. You can send e-mail anywhere in the world to anyone who has an e-mail address. Remember, almost all Internet service providers and all major online services offer at least one e-mail address with every account.
