Abstract [10 points]

The abstract should be between 250 and 300 words. It summarises the main aspects of the paper in a single paragraph. It should briefly explain the research's purpose, methods, results, discussion, and conclusion. Abstracts without the full paper will NOT be accepted.

Keywords: [list up to not more than **five** keywords]

1. Introduction (10 points)

This template offers guidelines for authors to format their manuscripts. The manuscript should range from 4,000 to 6,000 words, including the abstract and references. Besides the abstract, the paper must include five main sections: Introduction, Literature Review, Methodology, Results and Discussion, and Conclusion, along with an Acknowledgement section and references.

The paper must be original and not have been previously accepted by a journal or be currently under consideration for publication elsewhere.

The paragraphs continue from here and are only separated by headings, subheadings, images, tables, and formulae. The section headings are numbered, in bold, and 10 pt.

2. Font size and page limits

The entire manuscript must be formatted in Times New Roman using MS Word. 'KALAHAM' font can be used for Tamil text. The font size for the entire manuscript should be 10 points, and the manuscript should not exceed 10 A4 pages.

3. Margins

When formatting the page, set the margins as specified in Table 1.

4. Structure

Files must be submitted in MS Word format only and should be formatted for direct printing using the provided MS Word template. Figures and tables should be embedded within the document and not supplied separately. When typing manuscripts, follow this order: Title, Authors, Affiliations, Abstract, Keywords, Main text (including figures and tables), Acknowledgements, References.

Please do not modify the formatting and style layouts established in this template document. As shown in the template, papers should be prepared in a single-column format suitable for direct printing. Leave a blank line between paragraphs.

5. Tables

All tables should be numbered with Arabic numerals. Each table must have a caption. Headings should be centered above the tables. Only horizontal lines (3-line format) should be used within a table. Below is an example that the authors may find helpful.



6. Figures

Figures can include graphics, photos, charts, and others, but not tables. Figures usually follow the paragraph where they are first mentioned. An example of a figure is shown in Figure 1 below.

Figure 1: The Research Framework



The caption of the figure should be placed above the figure. It should be clear and at least 300 dpi. The font used in the figure is different from the font used in the text or the figure caption. The font in the figure should be between 6 and 8 points.

7. Reference

The manuscript's documentation should adhere to the APA 7th edition (American Psychological Association) publication manual for citations and references. References must be listed at the end of the paper, and not start on a new page unless absolutely necessary. Authors should ensure that every in-text reference appears in the reference list and vice versa.

An example of how your reference should be listed is provided at the end of this template in the reference section.

8. Heading

Section headings and subheadings should be bold, 10-point font, left-justified, with the first letter capitalized and numbered constructively.

9. Paper Submission

10. Equations

Use common fonts like Times New Roman in your math equations. A math reference in a paragraph sentence, such as

 $\alpha \vartheta$ is not numbered. The steps of a mathematical argument can be numbered using a right-aligned tab for s clarity, for example

$$\frac{\underline{b}}{2ac} \pm \sqrt{\underline{b} - 2ac}$$

11. Acknowledgements

Acknowledgements should be left justified, bold, with the first letter capitalised, and no numbers. The text below continues normally. An example of an acknowledgement is: Researchers are thankful to for providing the funding support and the necessary facilities for the research.

12. Others

Abbreviations should be written in full the first time they appear in the text, with each abbreviated form placed in parentheses.

At least one author of each accepted paper must register and pay the conference fees by 5th March 2026, for the paper to be included in the presentation and proceedings.

The committee will nominate the editorial board for the refereed edited book.
